

Traffic Analysis Zones

PURPOSE

A traffic analysis zone (TAZ) is a special area delineated by state and/or local transportation officials (in this case, the Northern Indiana Regional Planning Commission) for tabulating and modeling vehicular trip-related data, especially journey-to-work and place-of-work statistics; for the purposes of long-range transportation planning. A TAZ usually consists of one or more census blocks, block groups, or census tracts. 30 TAZs compose the Planning Area.

TEC Map 3, *Traffic Analysis Zones (TAZ) 2015 Population*, depicts Base Year 2015 population estimates for each TAZ.
